North Macedonia	<p>Entrance to North Macedonia is forbidden to all foreigners coming from high and medium risk countries, in accordance with the list issued by the WHO.</p> <p>At the border with Greece, the entrance in the next 30 days is allowed only for Greek citizens and foreigners with legal permits.</p> <p>There is a prohibition on movement for all citizens from 9PM until 5AM. (for weekends from 4PM to 5AM)</p> <p>The Government adopted a Decree imposing that the citizens arriving at the border crossing points of entry into the country shall be transported to the state quarantines every day at 10:00 AM and 8:00 PM.</p> <p>The Government requested the Office of the Prime Minister in cooperation with the Ministry of Finance – Customs Administration, Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Interior, The Ministry of Agriculture and</p>	<p>By Decision of the Government, all BCP are closed for foreign citizens, passengers and vehicles.</p> <p>Entrance and transit of heavy good vehicles, representatives of diplomatic missions, as well as of other persons for which the Ministry of Interior issues a special permit remain possible. Heavy good vehicles and persons can enter the country only in accordance to the Health Protocol for special protection measures issued by the Ministry of Health.</p> <p>Freight transport remains normal, but entrance and exit during night are forbidden.</p> <p>Passenger train traffic operates in restricted traffic conditions.</p>	<p>Skopje Airport and Ohrid Airport are closed.</p>

	<p>Water Economy and the Ministry of Transport and Communications to coordinate the activities related to the implementation of the measures contained in the Joint Proposal of the Permanent Secretariat of the Transport Community and the CEFTA Secretariat.</p> <p>The Government has reviewed and accepted the Joint Proposal of the Permanent Secretariat of the Transport Community and CEFTA Secretariat to facilitate transport and trade of essential goods in Western Balkans.</p> <p>As of 8th April, curfew will be extended from 4 PM to 5 AM every day.</p> <p>The Government adopted two regulations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - first enabling postponement of the exams for professional competence of transport workers and drivers for participation in international road traffic, during the state of emergency. The validity of drivers' professional competence certificates for participation in international road traffic whose validity has expired, is extended during the state of emergency. -second enabling postponement of the exams for transport of dangerous goods during the state of emergency. <p>The validity of all certificates related to transport of dangerous goods that have expired is extended during the state of emergency.</p>

	<p>All citizens of the Republic of North Macedonia, entering the country after 13th April 2020, returning from countries at high risk of COVID-19 - in accordance with the list of the World Health Organization (WHO), shall be determined the measure of strict isolation (quarantine) for at least 21 days from the day of arrival in North Macedonia.</p>

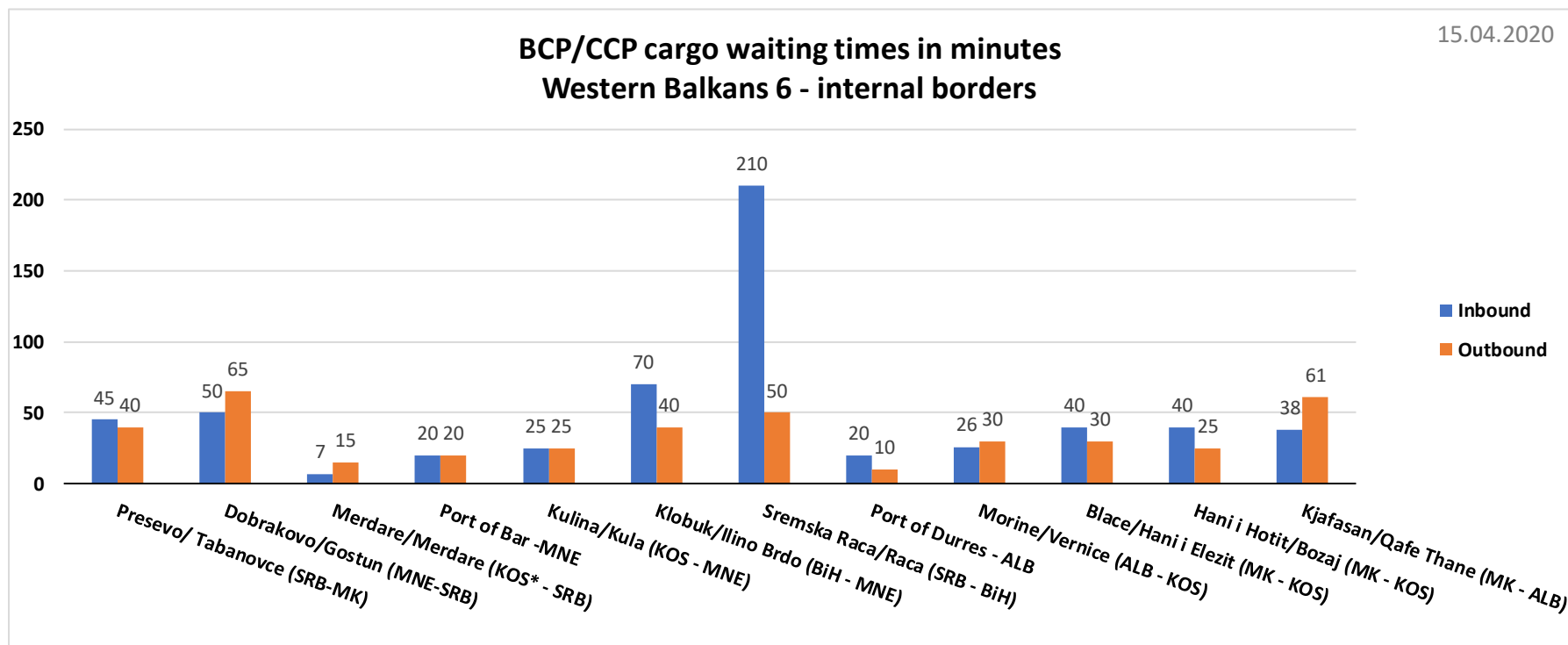
