One train of ore bauxite for export is being unloaded.

One train of iron ore is being loaded (final destination Smederevo).


One train of copper ore is being loaded (final destination Bor).


## **MONITORING OF ROAD BORDER CROSSING WAITING TIMES**

All data comes from Western Balkans partners reports/measuring, official information from Croatia, Hungary, Romania and road transport hauliers unofficial reporting.

Priority was given to WB6 official reporting (collected by the TCT on a daily basis), information from EU Member States and road hauliers being only used to bridge the gaps.

The chart above reflects the BCP situation at 12.00 h. All figures are indicative, as traffic volumes at all border crossing points are fluid and the situation might significantly change within hours (especially where transit is being organised in convoys).
