Kosovo*	Kosovo* nationals returning from abroad are placed in mandatory 7 day in quarantine. Citizens can spend daily 2 x 1.5 hour outside. Free movement is granted to all economic operators. There are no restrictions on goods transportation. Free circulation is provided for economic operators classified as important, as well as free transport of goods / services to ensure supply chain operation.	Points are open for international freight transport. Passenger railway transport is restored for the Peja-Pristina line.	Since 16 th March 2020, air travel at Pristina Airport is suspended, except for military flights and medical emergencies. Exceptions are crewoperated round-trip lines, but without passengers and serving only travellers leaving Kosovo*.	
		The measures taken for rail, urban and interurban transport are as follows: Passengers without masks are not allowed to enter the transport vehicle.


