WESTERN BALKANS

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| Bosnia and Herzegovina | <p>The Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina issued an order on restriction of movement of citizens in its territory from 6:00 PM to 5:00 AM, which came into force on 22nd March 2020.</p> <p>Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Federal Authority of Civil Protection issued an order that bans movement of citizens and staying outdoors without keeping a distance less than 1.5 metres.</p> <p>At the proposal of the Ministry of Communication and Transport, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina adopted the Joint proposal prepared by the Permanent Secretariat of the Transport Community and the CEFTA Secretariat to facilitate the transport and trade of essential goods within the Western Balkans.</p> <p>Entry to Bosnia and Herzegovina is enabled for nationals of neighbouring countries who enter Bosnia and Herzegovina for agricultural purposes and who have agricultural land in Bosnia and Herzegovina, when crossing the state border for the purpose of performing agricultural work on that land.</p> | <p>In case of international transit by road, cargo crew cannot stay more than 12 hours on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina.</p> <p>The Council of Ministers adopted a Decision with a list of border crossing points between Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Republic of Serbia and Montenegro for the transport of goods in transit and routes allowing the movement of freight motor vehicles registered in other countries in transit.</p> <p>The border crossings for transit through Bosnia and Herzegovina with the Republic of Serbia: Rača – Sremska Rača and with Montenegro: Klobuk – Ilino Brdo.</p> <p>Some rail border crossings, including Sremska Raca and Mokra Gora with Serbia, are closed. BCP Brasina/Mali Zvornik with Serbia works from 07-</p> | <p>Airports in Sarajevo, Mostar, Banja Luka and Tuzla closed from 30th March 2020.</p> | |

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| | <p>Foreign citizens entering Republika Srpska for business purpose, must provide a negative Sars-Cov-2 test, not older than 48 hours and an invitation letter from a company-employer.</p> <p>Restriction of movement on the territory of Republika Srpska is cancelled.</p> <p>Measure of mandatory self-isolation on the territory of Republika Srpska and Bosnia and Herzegovina is cancelled.</p> <p>Decision amending the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for entry of foreigners into Bosnia and Herzegovina is adopted, which allows business people to enter BiH, and families of those who died for burial, under certain conditions:</p> <p>Entry and stay of a foreigner who enters Bosnia and Herzegovina due to business obligations is enabled, provided that he has an invitation from a legal entity from Bosnia and Herzegovina that hires him in BiH and a certificate of a negative test for SARS-CoV-2 virus from an authorized laboratory, not older than 48 hours from the time of entry. Citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina who have dual citizenship may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina with an identity card issued by the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina, regardless of the method of entry into another state, from which they return.</p> <p>Foreigners, close family members (spouse, parents, children, siblings) of the deceased are allowed to</p> | <p>19:00 based on agreement between railway undertakings. Custom is available 24h, working by call.</p> <p>Republic Headquarter for Emergency Situations of Republika Srpska adopted Conclusion on work of Custom Unit Zvornik (Karakaj), demanding from Indirect Taxation Authority to organize custom service in Custom Unit Zvornik (Karakaj) 00-24h for unrestricted flow of goods.</p> <p>The Croatian National Civil Protection Headquarters has decided that as of 19 April 2020 at 18:00h, there will be no more escorts for trucks arriving in Bosnia and Herzegovina, with aim to significantly reduce the detentions at border crossing points.</p> <p>In Republika Srpska, passenger public road transport is re-established from 11th May.</p> <p>As of 15th May, public road and railway transport on the territory of Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina is re-established.</p> <p>As of 19th May 2020 at 00.00, transit of freight traffic through all border crossing points of the Republic of</p> | | |

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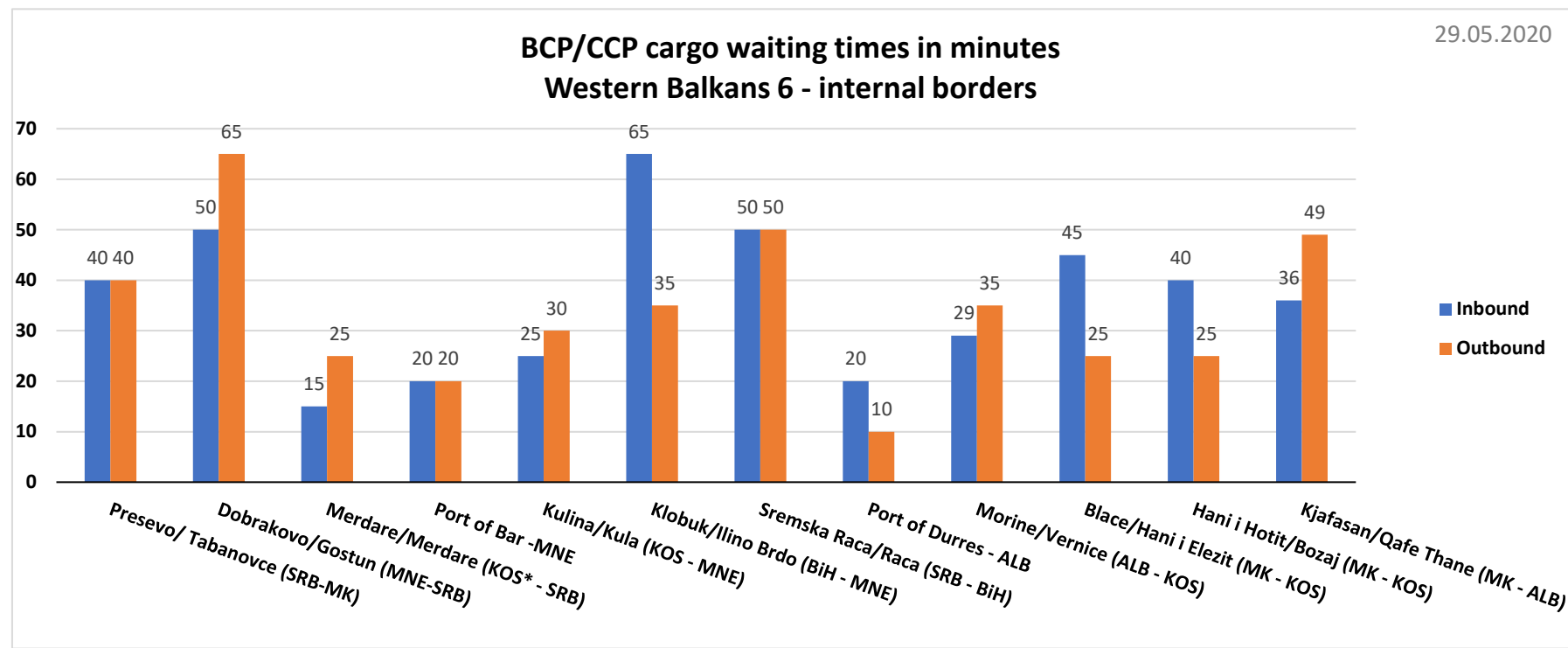
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| | <p>Health Institute, to allow foreign nationals to enter Montenegro from 1st June, without prescribing quarantine and self-isolation measures, provided that the key criteria for entry is a rate of active coronavirus cases of less than 25 per 100,000 inhabitants in the country of which the foreigner is a resident and in the country from which the foreigner enters Montenegro.</p> <p>Montenegrin citizens and foreigners, with permanent or temporary residence, who enter Montenegro from countries where the confirmed rate of active cases of coronavirus is higher than 25 per 100,000 inhabitants are ordered to be placed in self-isolation or quarantine for 14 days.
