Montenegro	Suspension of public transport of passengers in international road, rail and air traffic except for charter transport organized for the return of Montenegrin nationals and foreign nationals to their home country, with the consent of the National Infectious Diseases Coordination Body is extended until 1 June 2020. The National Coordination Body for Communicable Diseases decided, at the suggestion of the Public Health Institute, to allow foreign nationals to enter Montenegro from 1 June, without prescribing quarantine and self-isolation measures, provided that the key criteria for entry is a rate of active coronavirus cases of less than 25 per 100,000 inhabitants in the country of which the foreigner is a resident and in the country from which the foreigner enters Montenegro.	As of 1 June, Montenegro will open all road border crossings to neighbouring countries that were closed as part of measures against the spread of coronavirus. From midnight, the following border crossings are open: With the Republic of Albania: - Grnčar – Baškim, Plav – Shkoder road route and - Sukobin – Murićan, Ulcinj – Shkoder road route.
