<b>Kosovo*</b>	<p>Kosovo nationals returning from abroad are placed in mandatory 7 day in quarantine.</p> <p>Free movement is granted to all economic operators.</p> <p>There are no restrictions on goods transportation.</p> <p>Free circulation is provided for economic operators classified as important, as well as free transport of goods / services to ensure supply chain operation.</p> <p>As of 28<sup>th</sup> May free movement is enabled from 5AM to 9PM every day.</p> <p>As of 1 June, the following BCP are open for passengers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• KOS/SRB: Merdare, Jarinje and Dheu i Bardhe,</li> <li>• KOS/ALB: Vërmice,</li> <li>• KOS/MNE: Kullë,</li> <li>• KOS/NMK: Hani i Elezit</li> </ul>	<p>Land borders are closed for travellers entering Kosovo, with the exception of Kosovo citizens, who are obliged to spend 7 days in quarantine.</p> <p>All major Border/ Common Crossing Points are open for international freight transport.</p> <p>Passenger railway transport is restored for the Peja-Pristina line. Urban and inter-urban bus transport is also restored. Freight railway transport continues in national and international lines.</p> <p>The measures taken for rail, urban and interurban transport are as follows: Passengers without masks are not allowed to enter the transport vehicle;</p>	<p>Since 16<sup>th</sup> of March 2020, air travel at Pristina Airport is suspended, except for military flights and medical emergencies. Exceptions are crew-operated round-trip lines, but without passengers and serving only travellers leaving Kosovo.</p>

	<p>There will be medical screening of all passengers entering Kosovo who must show a negative Covid-19 test not older than 4 days. In the absence of such test, they must self-isolate for 7 days.</p>	<p>If a citizen is not wearing a mask, both the citizen and the company shall be punished (in accordance with the applicable provisions);          50 % of the capacity of seats is used by respecting the distance;          No more than one person is allowed in a seat of seats;          Movement shall be done in accordance with the movement schedule;          Disinfection means of transportation three times a day according to the instructions for disinfection;          Mark the distance of 1.5 m in urban buses.          As of 1<sup>st</sup> June all trucks entering Kosovo shall undergo a disinfecting procedure performed by a contractor at the border. The fees are payable by the drivers and they cost, depending on the weight, up to 22 Euros.  <b>The decision for disinfection of trucks entering Kosovo has been suspended on 1<sup>st</sup> of June in the afternoon.</b></p>

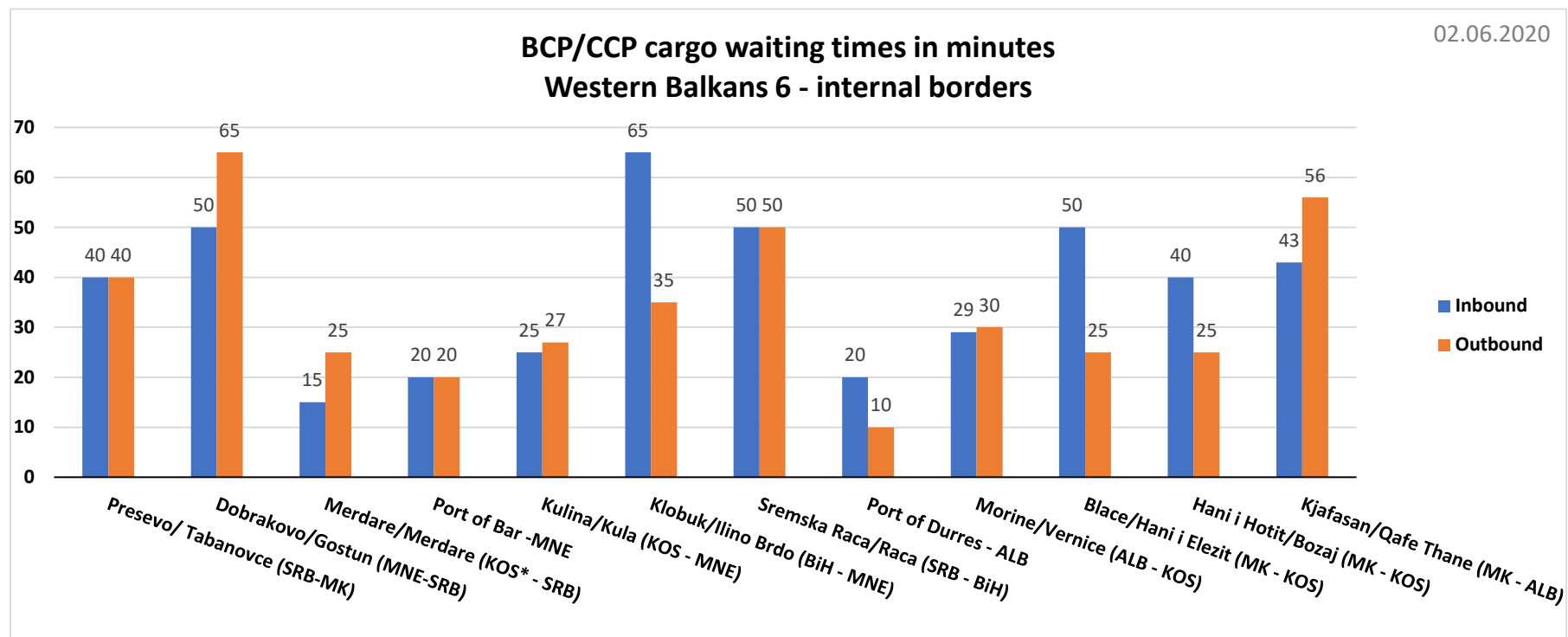
