Bosnia and Herzegovina	At the proposal of the Ministry of Communication and Transport, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina adopted the Joint proposal prepared by the Permanent Secretariat of the Transport Community and the CEFTA Secretariat to facilitate the transport and trade of essential goods within the Western Balkans.	In Republika Srpska, passenger public road transport is re-established from 11 <sup>th</sup> May. As of 2 <sup>nd</sup> June, entrance to BiH by foreigners - children and spouses of citizens of Bosnia and Herzegovina is enabled.	Herzegovina may take place at every border crossing point. All border crossing points between Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Republic of Croatia are open for the transport of goods in transit.

As of 16 July, citizens of EU member states and	
Schengen member states are allowed to enter and	
stay in BiH, as well as foreigners who have a	
multiple Schengen visa or a visa of European Union	
countries or an appropriate residence permit in the	
European Union and the Schengen area, provided	
they have a certificate of negative SARS-COV-2	
test, not older than 48 hours from the moment of	
entry.	
Citizens of the Republic of Croatia are exempted	
from this decision in accordance with the	
previously adopted Decision on prescribing	
additional conditions for entry of foreigners into	
BiH, which stipulates they are allowed to enter BiH	
together with citizens of Serbia and Montenegro.

Serbia: No change since previous report.


