
Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans land borders Weekly overview (10-14 august 2020)


BORDER MONITORING


During the second week of August, the situation has remained stable at the EU-WB6 TEN-T Border Crossing Points, which seems to be confirming the trend already observed in July.




With few exceptions only, waiting times have been mostly exceeding the 15 minutes ambitious threshold set-up for the Green Lanes.


A positive evolution has been recorded in Gradina/Kalotina, with average waiting times recorded from 10th to 14th of July being significantly lower than those recorded during the month of July. The same positive trend could be observed in Bogorodica – Evzoni and Batrovci/Bajakovo as well, the latest being one of the most crowded Border Crossing Points between EU and Wester Balkans.







At the opposite side, average waiting times have kept growing in Horgos/Roszke on the outbound direction, making it, by some margin, the most crowded of all Border Crossing Points in the region.



No significant variations have been recorded for the other TEN-T Border Crossing Points under monitoring.

Data comes mostly from Western Balkans partners official reporting, such figures being further checked against all available alternative sources (Sixfold, Member States official reporting, road hauliers reporting and live cameras monitoring).
