Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 land borders Weekly overview (11 - 15 January 2021)

BORDER MONITORING

The second week of the year has brought sudden worsening of traffic conditions in the most crowded BCPs between Western Balkans and the EU (Horgos/Roszke and Batrovci/Bajakovo). Such evolution was not unexpected, after the record lows registered during the winter break. Waiting times were also on an increasing pace in Gradina/Kalotina, while for the rest of the BCPs under monitoring the situation remained stable.




Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
