

Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 TEN-T land borders Weekly overview (01 – 05 February 2021)

BORDER MONITORING

The first week of February has brought slightly improvements in Batrovci/Bajakovo and Horgos/Roszke. However, waiting times in Batrovci/Bajakovo remain high, making it the most crowded BCP in Western Balkans area for the second week in a row. Situation in Gradina/Kalotina has also turned worse, while average waiting times in Gradiksa/Stara Gradiska have come close to 1h on HR – BiH direction. Improvements have been seen in Kakavija/Ktismata (based on unofficial road hauliers reporting) while for the other BCPs under monitoring the situation has remained stable.

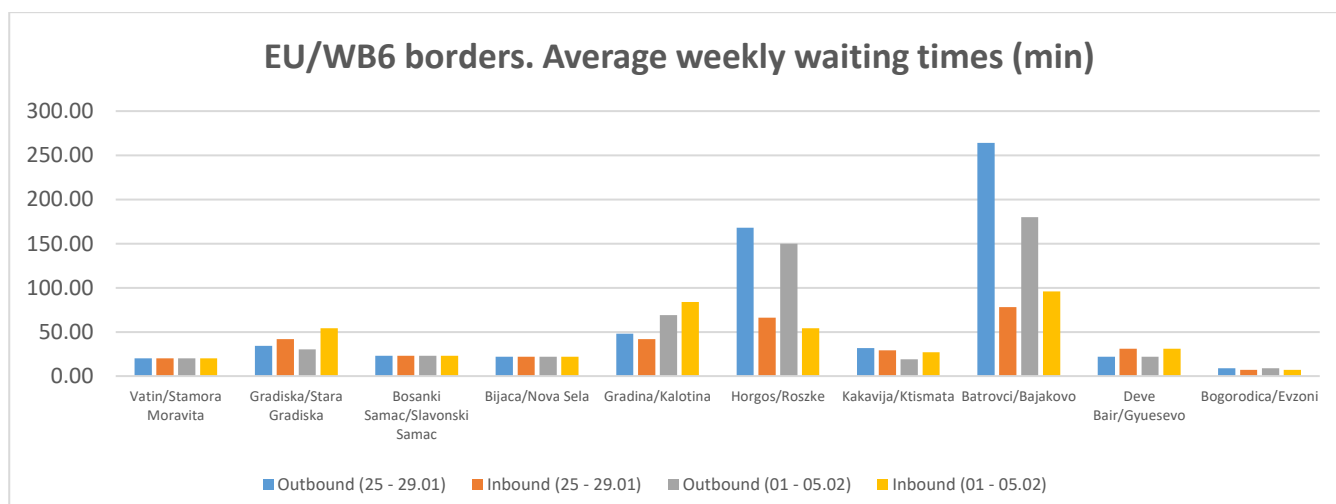


Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
