

Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 TEN-T land borders Weekly overview (05 – 09 April 2021)

BORDER MONITORING

With the sole exception of Kakavija/Ktismata that went significantly better, waiting times were on an increasing pace in the region. In Gradiska/Stara Gradiska, the BiH – HR direction witnessed prolonged waiting times for 2 days in a row, which were further reflected in the weekly average. Gradina/Kalotina also experienced slightly longer waiting times on both directions. In Horgos/Roszke and Batrovci/Bajakovo the increase was sharp on SRB-HUN and SRB-HR directions, with worst figures ever recorded and road hauliers unofficial reporting of waiting times exceeding 24h. The registered decrease in waiting times on HUN-SRB and HR-SRB directions was far from being sufficient to compensate the above. For the other Border Crossing Points under monitoring, situation remained stable as confirmed by the figures presented below.

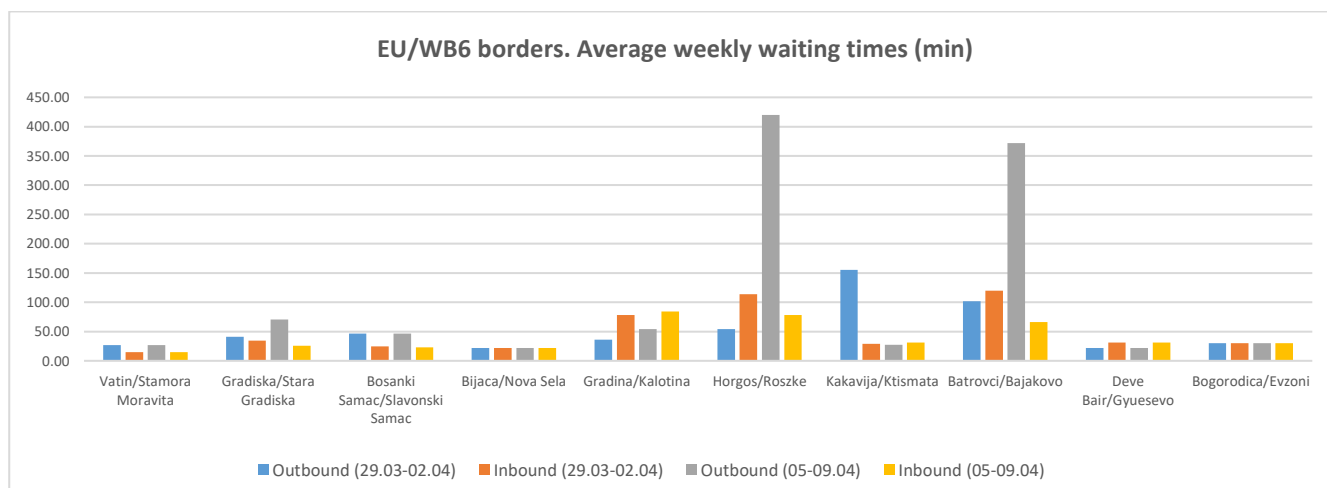


Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
