

## Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 TEN-T land borders Weekly overview (22 – 26 March 2021)

### BORDER MONITORING

Average waiting times in both Horgos/Roszke and Batrovci/Bajakvo decreased (the latter for the second week in a row, from previously recorded peak values). Situation at EL border remained worrying with Kakavija/Ktismata becoming the second most crowded BCP in the region on AL-EL direction (just below Horgos/Roszke) and Bogorodica/Evzoni still reporting longer than usual waiting times (average reported figures should be taken cautiously, as not fully reflecting the situation from the drivers' perspective). At BiH-HR border, Gradiska/Stara Gradiska turned worse, while Bosanski Samac/Slavonski Samac went better. The rest of the BCPs in the region remained stable.

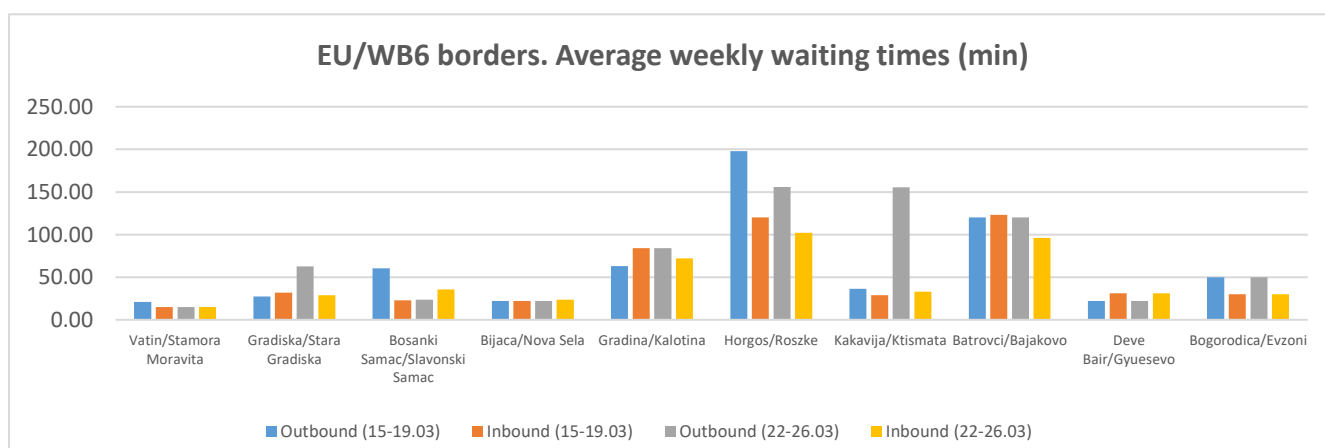


Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
