BORDER MONITORING

Waiting times in Horgos on SRB-HUN direction decreased significantly, close to an all-time record. Batrovci/Bajakovo remained more or less stable, the decrease in waiting times on SRB-HR direction being compensated by comparable increase on the opposite side. Gradina/Kalotina and Gradiska/Stara Gradiska went also better, despite a slight increase on the inbound direction. Bogorodica/Evzoni also reported improvements on the outbound direction but reported waiting times remained well above the average. Kakavija/Ktismata reported no improvement from lats week's record high. Vatin/Stanora Moravita and Bosanski Samac/Slavonski Samac turned worse on the outbound direction while the rest of the BCP under monitoring remained stable.




Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
