Data and analysis



- EU-wide, 4000 fewer lives lost compared to 2019, a decrease of 17%; influence Covid
- Over last decade, a decrease of 36% (only Greece >50% but 9 countries 40% or more)

- We continue to monitor short-term data (daily/weekly/monthly/quarterly) in 2021
- Future monitoring: Baseline year for 2021-2030 to be 2019 (average 2017-19 alongside)
- New categories for micro-mobility to be introduced in to CARE
- New template for countries to report data on serious injuries (MAIS3+ and hospitalisation)

EU project on Road Safety Key Performance indicators



- 8 KPIs are integral part of EU Road Safety Policy Framework 2021-2030
- BASELINE project consortium led by VIAS (BE)
- EC funding to 19 Member States to support data collection and analysis of KPIs
- Guidance on the minimum methodology requirements recently published for 6 of the 8 KPIs:
 - Speed; safety belts; protective equipment; alcohol; distraction; post-crash care

 - Inception Impact Assessment open for comments till 21 May
