

Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 TEN-T land borders Weekly overview (10 – 14 May 2021)

BORDER MONITORING

After the Easter break, situation got worse in most of the Border Crossing Points under monitoring. Some of them, like Vatin/Stamora Moravita, Gradiska/Stara Gradiska or Bosanski Samac/Slavonski Samac were just returning to the “business-as-usual” scenario. Despite an overall worsening, Gradina/Kalotina remained remarkably traffic-free on the outbound (SRB-BG) direction. Horgos/Roszke witnessed a sudden increase in both directions, coming close to the all-time weekly record highs. Batrovci/Bajakovo also went worse in particular on the inbound (HR-SRB) direction, which usually experiences lower average waiting times.

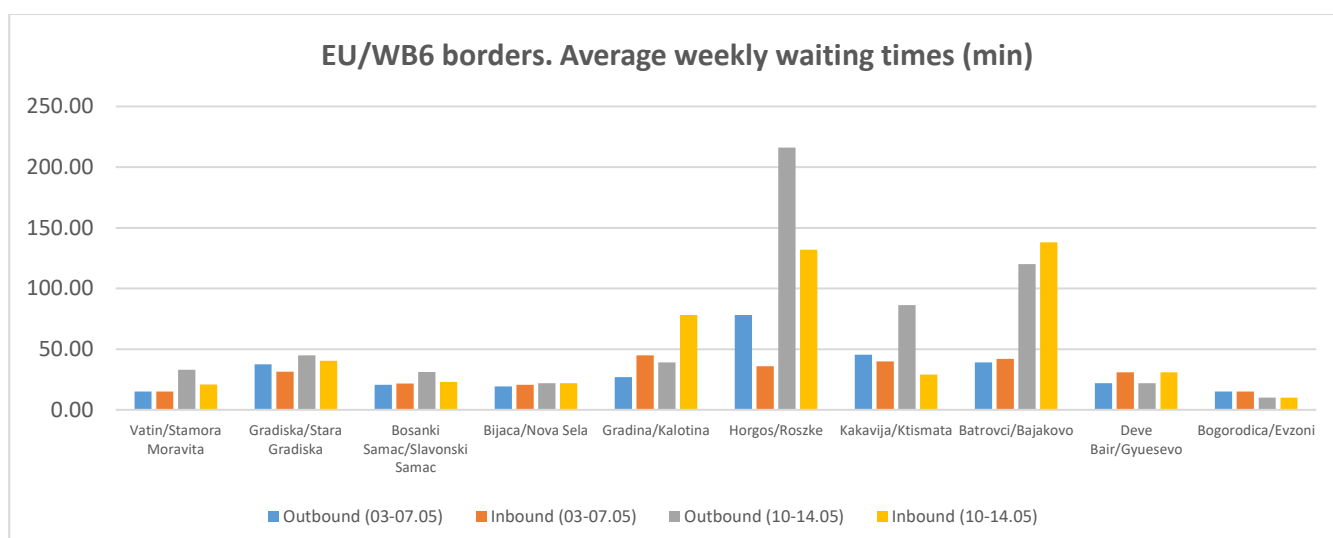


Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
