Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 TEN-T land borders Weekly overview (17 – 21 May 2021)

BORDER MONITORING

After the sudden traffic and waiting times increase that followed the Easter break, situation mostly stabilized at EU/WB6 borders. As compared with the week before, waiting times in Horgos/Roszke decreased, remaining yet above average. Batrovci/Bajakovo was stable, with similar variations on both directions. Gradina/Kalotina and Vatin/Stamora Moravita improved also, but Kakavija/Ktismata experienced a sharp worsening on the ALB – EL direction. For all the other BCPs under monitoring, waiting times remained more or less stable.




Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
