

Monitoring of EU/Western Balkans 6 TEN-T land borders Weekly overview 27 – 31 December 2021)

BORDER MONITORING

As expected, the week following Christmas brought major improvements all over the region, with waiting times close to the “no traffic” scenario. Improvements were more visible in the most congested BCPs in the region, namely Horgos/Roszke, Batrovci/Bajakovo and Gradina/Kalotina where waiting times went down significantly (Gradina/Kalotina was the only BCP in the region where average waiting times exceeded 1 hour, on the BG-SRB direction). Decreased waiting times were also registered at BiH – HR border (Gradiska/Stara Gradiska and Bosanski Samac/Slavonski Samac) as well as in Kakavija/Ktismata. The other BCPs under monitoring remained stable.

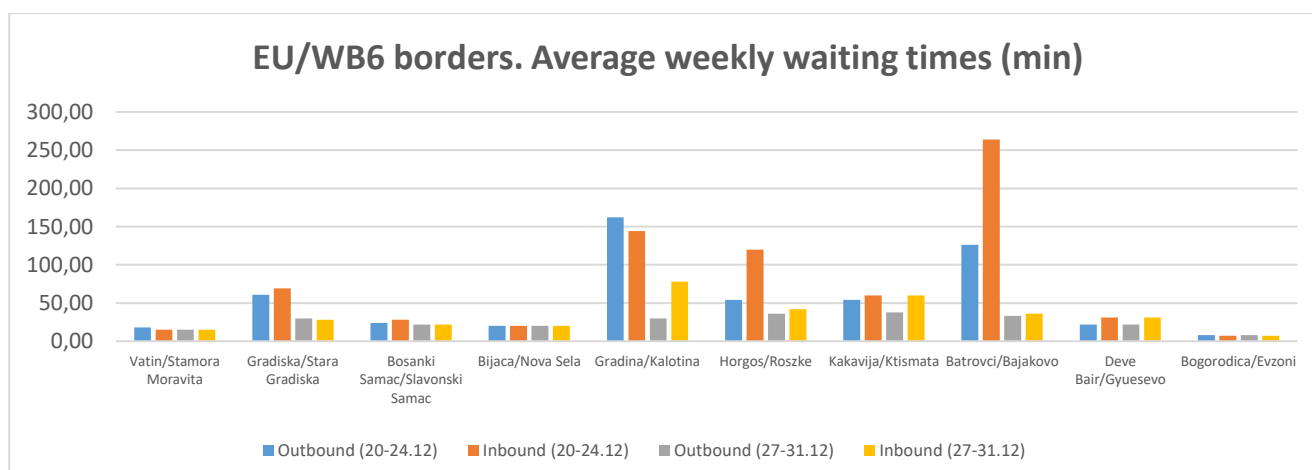


Figure 1: Average weekly waiting times (consecutive weekly trends)
