Directive 2008/68/EC



- Translation of ADR, RID and ADN into regional languages, where applicable, by 2023
- Several Regional Partners reported issues in organising this activity
- TDG Technical Committee is invited to ask for support from the Regional Steering Committee view to financing of the translations

Promising perspectives/ work in progress

• Albania – Art. 63 in Law no. 118/2012 stipulates that bylaws should be drafted "in order to approximate and update the legislation on transport of dangerous goods".

State of play as seen by TC PS



- Kosovo (*) Art. 60 Translation and publication of the agreements –
 "shall be carried out periodically whenever (ADR and RID are)
 reviewed and republished" (Law no 04/L-138 on land transport of
 dangerous goods)
- Bosnia and Herzegovina (Republika Srpska) Art. 69(1) The Ministry of Transport and Communications shall provide the translation of international agreements and their Annexes into one of the official languages of the Republic of Srpska for the purpose of publishing and making it available on their web page. (L a w on transport of dangerous goods, 15/16)

Transposition Challenges



- Biannual amendments to the Agreements are not reflected in the laws
- The change in the <u>title of ADR</u> is not reflected in any of the legal documents consulted so far
- In one case, for example, the scope of application of Directive 2008/68/EC, namely the exemption applicable for vehicles belonging to or under the supervision of armed forces is complemented with the exemption from 1.1.3.3 concerning the fuel present in the tanks of vehicles
- In the Definitions articles, in all the consulted legislation, the definitions of the participants in TDG from section 1.2.1 Definitions of ADR/RID are taken over. However, the latest added participants e.g. the unloader, filler- are not inserted/updated.

Inspection



Directive 95/50/EC

- ⇒'transport` shall mean any road transport operation performed by a vehicle wholly or partly on public roads within the territory of a Member State, including the loading and unloading of goods covered by Directive 2008/68/EC, without prejudice to the arrangements laid down by the laws of the Member States concerning liability in respect of such operations,
- ⇒ 'check` shall mean any check, control, inspection, verification or formality carried out by the competent authorities for reasons of safety inherent in the transport of dangerous goods.
- Inspection attribute of the Member States

Directive 2010/35/EU

- ADR/RID 1.8.6 Administrative controls for application of the conformity assessments, periodic inspections and exceptional checks described in 1.8.7
- Activities performed by inspection bodies, in relation with the use for cylinders and tanks for Class 2 according to Directive 2010/35/EU on transportable pressure equipment
- See for example the definitions "periodic inspection" (Art. 2 (18) TPED) and "intermediate inspection" (Art.2 (19) TPED).
- 3rd party evaluation of the product during use
- Functioning based on accreditation and standards application

Draft Roadmap of the enforcement activities on TDG



- Ad-Hoc Group for Enforcement of the Transport of Dangerous Goods Technical Committee
- The implementation of Directive 95/50/EC on uniform procedures for checks on the transport of dangerous goods by road
- Why is this necessary?

Guidelines on Transport of Dangerous Goods

- By the end of 2022, all regional partners will clarify the administrative structures to be put in place for transposition and implementation of Directive 95/50/EC and will consider developing common cross-border harmonised roadside checks on TDG.
- By the date when Directive 2008/68/EC will be transposed (i.e. 2023), Directive 95/50/EC will be transposed as a package.
- By the end of 2022, all regional partners will apply for initial training programmes dedicated to Directive 95/50/EC and will establish their domestic training plan for ADR enforcement."

First steps

- Work on definition of the delegations
- Participate in the event in Romania September 2022
- Initiate common checks in the region for exchanges of experience
- Consider establishing a more formal cooperation either via a Memorandum of Understanding or an Annex to the Guidelines
