Ongoing discussions



- Mutual Assistance regarding smart tachograph cards in the framework of the Treaty establishing the Transport Community (TCT)
- Draft paper provided by the European Commission at the initiative of Slovenia Legal basis
- Article 40 of Regulation (EU) No 165/2014 establishes that "Member States shall assist each other in applying this Regulation and in checking compliance therewith."
- Discussions were held on this issue on the occasion of the 7th session of the TDG Technical Committee meeting, 14 June 2022



Ongoing discussions






- All vehicles registered in the EU since 15
 June 2019 are fitted with the first version
 of a smart tachograph. The
 implementation of the smart tachograph
 entails the obligation for Member States
 to be able to issue tachograph cards to
 drivers, workshops, road transport
 undertakings and control officers residing
 or established in their territories.
- Due to a possible lack of supply of digital non-smart tachograph card chips, some South East European Parties which have not yet fully migrated to the smart tachograph system are at risk of no longer being able to issue tachograph cards.

Solution





• A time period of up to 6 months, renewable once for a maximum of 6 additional months, is a reasonable timeframe to provide the temporary assistance and to allow the requesting Party to set up its smart tachograph card system and deliver its own cards.
